

The NETCo Scholarship Fund for Windsor, ME Residents Freshmen

The NETCo Scholarship fund for Windsor, ME Residents was created to provide a scholarship for Windsor students. Scholarships shall be awarded to individuals meeting the following criteria:

- Student must be a resident of Windsor and have resided there for the past seven (7) years continuously. Registering to vote, your driver's license, hunting and fishing license, or your motor vehicle registration may be used to establish your residency. Windsor School may be contacted to verify your attendance. A parent's Town tax bill could also be used as verification.
- 2. Student must be 25 years or younger.
- 3. Student must provide a high school transcript and fall semester class registration plus any high school activities with the current application.
- The competed, <u>original</u> Release Form <u>from your college</u> must be signed by the student and parent and submitted with each <u>original</u> application to the Windsor Town Office. (no copies/faxes)
- 5. Checks will be paid to the college during the second (2nd) semester if the student:
 - a) Is still in attendance.
 - b) Has signed up for second (2nd) semester classes.
 - c) Is not on academic or social probation. (We will be contacting the college/university at the beginning of the second semester to confirm)
- 6. Individual awards are limited to four (4) for undergraduate work and five (5) if graduate work is included.
- 7. Applications are available at the Windsor Town Office, on the Town of Windsor's website (<u>www.windsor.maine.gov</u>), Erskine Academy and other area high schools.
