(\$7.99 Amazon \$280.00), plus 35 copies of the novel *Chains* by Laurie Halse Anderson. This is a novel about two sisters who are slaves in the house of Loyalists during the American Revolution. It investigates the theme of freedom vs. slavery both on the individual level and on a national level as America was fighting for freedom from the British. This novel ties in with the social studies curriculum as it covers the American Revolution and slavery.
